Inside the Bootroom will give an insight to behind the scenes at Central SWPL team this edition looks at the impact of the player transfers are having on the club.

Kim McAlpine finally leaves the UK to take up her scholarship in the USA, travelling to Carson and Newman in Tennessee, leaving along with Morgan, Ellie and Shaney from the side that completed the pre-summer season with Central in the SWPL. To compound the player issue we have also lost Abby and Naomi to Stirling University, also Emma who has moved down south. So what of Central, we have signed new players however will be looking at the Central youth set up to bring in the next wave of talent 'she's one of our own' kinda thing.

The team formation has changed identifying the new players coming in strengths, we will always focus on passing and playing a free flowing style that brings so many plaudits. We are excited about the new players, future editions will have more information on all 3, but equally excited about the youth players that are stepping up into the SWPL and frankly being pushed to see how they respond, the young players are well equipped technically with their current league experiences at youth level, however not so at the physical side, however our style looks to exploit opposition through skill rather than brawn, an area that age will resolve rather than experience.



The management are looking to the fans to be patient and look to see the team reform and gel, the reality is that it is almost certainly too late for this season, how ever we have to look to the future and start the build ing process again. We have been through a lot from our formation a mere 4 years ago (3 seasons at senior) and given our track record in producing players for every national youth set up it is not if, but when we come back up and compete at the higher echelons on Scottish women's football.

One area of development is the retention of players, we can and do celebrate the US scholarships for the girls leaving this summer, however it's the players that move slightly up and across that is of concern, our investment into these talents bears no fruit financially or otherwise to the club, and we need to have a way of retaining these players beyond teenagers. Will SWF or the SWPL identify player development from the grass root clubs and come in line with the player compensation to the clubs, surely finance equals investment,

investment equals development, better provision equals better standards, we are at the whim of the year long contract and given the level we are playing at we simply see our player assets diminishing with no return...something has to give.

Consider of the finishing side of last season who won the SWFL Divison 1 title we have managed to retain 5 of our 16 player squad...
